# EXPLANATION FOR THE PROGRAMS OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT ACCEPT FOREIGN STUDENTS THROUGH YÖS-2002 

## A. HOW TO READ THE TABLE

Table - 1 is made up of four columns; in the first column are the code numbers of the higher education programs; in the second column are the names of these programs; in the third column are special notes for the programs and in the fourth column is the total number of students to be admitted is shown.
For "see 1", "see 2", etc. the section below headed "D. SPECIAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING TABLE-1" should be referred to. If there are no asterisks (*) or (**) placed beside the name of a higher education program then that program is of 4 years duration.
B. FOR YOUR ATTENTION

1. The candidate should only include in his/her list of preferences those programs for which he/she meets all the requirements. In cases of misrepresentation, the preferences involved will be discounted and a student placed in a program as such will lose the right to register.
2. In selecting a program you are advised to ensure that you possess the aptitude and skills necessary to enter this program.
3. If a program in this table is, for any reason, either not opened or discontinued, preferences made for that program will be disregarded. In that case, the subsequent preferences of the candidate will be taken into consideration in the placement procedure.
4. Should a specific program-coded in this Guide-receive a change of name or be attached to a different institution of higher education, students placed in that program will be required to abide by the regulations relating to the new conditions.

## D. SPECIAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING TABLE-1

see 1. When selecting a program, the candidate must have no physical or psychological defects that might affect a career in the field chosen. Students who have been selected according to the rules and regulations covering this examination may be asked to submit a health report verifying the above, at the time of registration.
8. The candidate must either pass the English Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year English Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of English language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The English Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
With this program, students who have not been successful in the Preparatory Course may start their undergraduate program, but sometime before they graduate they are required to pass the Proficiency Examination set by the University.

10. The candidate must either pass the German Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year German Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education
in which he/she has been placed. This year of German language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The German Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
see 11. Students who are unsuccessful in the Preparatory Course of this program are dismissed from the university.
see 12. The candidate must either pass the French Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year French Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of French language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The French Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
see 13. In order to register into this program the candidate should have no defects in speech.
see 14. With this program, students who have failed the Preparatory Course and consequently been dismissed, can in accordance with certain stipulations by OSYM, be placed in a parallel program where the language of instruction is Turkish.
see 15. Thirty percent of the instruction of this course is given in English.
see 16. The language of instruction is English.
see 17. To be successful in this program, an aesthetic sense, creativity, drawing skills and a feel for design are all essential
see 18. For students wishing to follow a one-year Preparatory Course in foreign languages with a quota, there is an additional year of study. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation.
see 19. At the registration time, students are required to submit a detailed medical report from a reputable hospital confirming that they have no physical or psychological problems that might hinder pursuing their career at an international level.
see 20. The candidate must either pass the Spanish Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year Spanish Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of Spanish Language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The Spanish Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
see 21. The candidate must either pass the Italian Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year Italian Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of Italian Language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The Italian Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
see 22. To be successful in this program a strong creative sense of design is essential as are dexterity of the hands and fingers.
see 23. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Atılım University are US \$ 6500 . The language of instruction is English. There is a one-year Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Students who are successful in the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the examinations (TOEFL, IELTS, FCE, CAE,CPE) recognised by the University are eligible to register into the first year of higher education program into which they have been placed. Students who are unable to complete the English Preparatory Course successfully in two consecutive years will be dismissed from the University.
see 24. For the 2002-2003 academic year, at Bahçeşehir University tuition fees are as follows: for the School of Foreign Languages and Information Sciences US \$ 6 500, for the degree programs US \$ 7 000. (Value Added Tax (VAT) (\%8) not included). The students pay the same tuition fees as US \$ in every year.
The language of instruction is English. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Those who pass the English Proficiency Test held at the start of the

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academic year or who have passed such an examination as is recognised as equivalent by the University e.g. TOEFL, IELTS, FCE, CPE and TWE may register directly into the programs in which they have been placed.
Students who are unsuccessful in the English Preparatory Course must follow an intensive Preparatory English Course organized by the School of Foreign Languages and Information Science of Bahçeşehir University. Those who pass this course are eligible to register into the first year of the program in which they have been placed. Students who are unsuccessful in this Preparatory Course in two consecutive years are dismissed from the University.
see 25. For the 2002-2003 academic year the tuition fees at Başkent University are US \$ 8 000. In every year tuition fees will be increased maximum 7.5 percent as US $\$$.
see 26. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course prior to the commencement of the program proper, which is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. However, those who pass the English Proficiency Test held at the start of the academic year or who have, within the last two years passed such examinations as are recognised as equivalent by the University as TOEFL, TWE, IELTS, FCE and CPE are exempt from the Preparatory Year and may register directly into the program they have been accepted for.
see 27. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Beykent University are Turkish Liras equal to 3500 English Pounds. The language of instruction is English. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Students who pass the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the international examinations (TOEFL, IELTS) recognised by the University register into the first year of the higher education program in which they have been placed. Students who are unable to complete the English Preparatory Course successfully in two consecutive years are dismissed from the University.
see 28. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Bilkent University are US $\$ 7$ 500. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included)
see 29. The language of instruction is English. Students are required to establish that their English is satisfactory by passing the University's English Proficiency Examination, or by attaining a satisfactory level in examinations recognised by the University as equivalent (TOEFL, TWE, IELTS, FCE, CPE) or by passing Bilkent's English Proficiency Test. Equivalencies of these examinations are valid for period of two years.
The students who are unsuccessful in the English Proficiency Test or in one of the international examinations may follow the Supporting or Preparatory Course organised by the University. The students who are unable to complete these courses are dismissed from the University.
If these students have been placed again at Bilkent on the results of the Examination for Foreign Students may enter the English Proficiency Test. The students who are successful in the Examination may register into the program they have been accepted for. If they don't they lose the right of being a student and they are given the space of one year in which to pass one of the international examinations that is recognised as equivalent by the University. If the students who are successful, are eligible to register into the program they have been accepted for. The students must pass such examinations in a year.The students who are successful in the English Preparatory Course, but leave course and then placed in a program are taken in the Language Examination of Bilkent University. After the Examination, according to their level of English, they follow the English Preparatory Course. The students who are unsuccessful in this Preparatory Course are dismissed from the University.
see 30. The language of instruction varies according to the requirements of the course, between French and English. In order to commence the program, students must pass the Proficiency Test in both languages. Those who fail to do so must follow a Preparatory Course in English and/or French as necessary.

For the supplementary foreign language and the Preparatory Course see 29.
see 31. Foreign students enter the Proficiency Examination organised by the University's School of Foreign Languages. Those who do not pass follow an intensive English Language Course. Those who then pass the Proficiency Test or such an international examinations as TOEFL or IELTS that is recognised as equivalent by the University, may then register into their degree course.
see 32. Students who successfully complete this program receive a Master Degree.
see 33. The language of instruction is English. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Students who pass the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the international examinations (TOEFL, IELTS) recognised by the University, are eligible to register into the first year of the higher education program in which they have been placed.
see 34. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Çankaya University are US \$ 5000.
see 35. For the 2002-2003 academic year the tuition fees at Doğuş University are US \$ 8000 for the degree programs in English, and the Preparatory Year.
see 36. The Language of instruction is English and French. The students take the Proficiency Test in English and in French. Those who do not pass the Proficiency Test, may follow the English and French Preparatory Course. The duration of this course is at most two years. These years are not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation.
see 37. Students who are unsuccessful in the Preparatory Course, may follow a Supplementary Course in the following year in accordance with the Education Regulations. Students who are unsuccessful in the Supplementary Course may start their undergraduate program, but sometime before the graduation they are required to pass the Proficiency Examination set by the University.
see 38. - -
see 39. In this program the main language of instruction is Turkish, but in some courses the language is English.
see 40. Students who choose this course will have to provide for themselves such aids as video-cassettes, cameras, films, flashes and tape-recorders as may be required for practical courses.
see 41. The candidate must either pass the English and German Language Proficiency Tests of the University or must follow the one-year English and German Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of English and German Language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The students who pass the Proficiency Test may start the first year of their degree programs.
see 42. In this program the medium of instructions is Turkish, but in some courses the language is German or English.
see 43. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Fatih University are for all Preparatory Courses and the Faculty of Sciences and Arts US \$ 5000, for the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences and the Faculty of Engineering US \$ 6 000. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included). The tuition fee is payable in two equal installments, at the beginning of the registration period and second semester.
see 44. For the 2002-2003 academic year the tuition fees at İzmir Ekonomi University are for all programs US \$ 5 500. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included). The tuition fees are payable in two equal installments at the beginning of the registration period and at the beginning of the second semester according to the Central Bank of Republic of Turkey foreign exchange offer rate.
see 45. The duration of education in Fashion and Designatory School is four years. The students take general courses in the first year. According to their interests and skills, the students take Confectionary Design, Textile Design and Industrial Design in the following years. There is a one year compulsory probation year in the four year education.

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see 46. There is a one-year German Preparatory Course. This year of German language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Those who pass the German Proficiency Test held at the start of the academic year or who have within the last five years passed such an examination as is recognised as equivalent by the University e.g. KPDS, PNDS, ZDP and ZMP are exempt from the Preparatory Course and may register directly into the program they have been accepted into.
see 47. In this program the Language of Instruction is French. In order to register into this program, students must first pass the French Proficiency Test organised by the University. Those who do not, follow a one-year French Language Preparatory Course. Students who are successful at the end of the course, then start one-year program of Advanced French and an Introduction to Basic Social Studies. Students who are successful at the end of this course then start their four-year degree program.
see 48. The language of instruction is French. Students who have been placed in this program must pass the French Proficiency Test organised by the University. Students whose competence in French falls short of the required standard must follow a French Language Preparatory Course for one year
see 49. The candidate must either pass the Arabic Language Proficiency Test of the University or must follow the one-year Arabic Preparatory Course of the institution of higher education in which he/she has been placed. This year of Arabic Language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. The Arabic Language Proficiency Test will be organized by the institution of higher education where he/she has been placed.
see 50. The language of instruction is French.
see 51. The language of instruction is German.
see 52. There is a one-year German Preparatory Course. This year of German language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Those who pass the German Proficiency Test held at the start of the academic year or who have within the last five years passed such an examination as is recognised as equivalent by the University e.g. KPDS, PNDS, GDS, KDS, ZDP and ZMP are exempt from the Preparatory Course and may register directly into the program they have been accepted into.
see 53. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year of English language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Those who pass the English Proficiency Test held at the start of the academic year or who have, within the last five years passed such an examination as is recognised as equivalent by the University e.g. KPDS, TOEFL, IELTS, FCE, CPE and CAE are exempt from the Preparatory Course and may register directly into the program they have been accepted into.
see 54. There is a one-year French Preparatory Course. This year of French language training is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Those who pass the French Proficiency Test held at the start of the academic year or who have, within the last five years passed an examination as is recognised as equivalent by the University e.g. KPDS and DELF, are exempt from the Preparatory Course and may register directly into the program they have been accepted into
see 55. Haliç University was established by Bizim Lösemili Çocuklar Foundation and it is a trust-endowed University. For the 20022003 academic year, the Haliç University tuition fees are as follows: for the School of Nursing US \$ 2000, for the English Preparatory Course, Turkish Music, Theater at Conservatory, American Culture and Literature and Psychology US \$4000, for the Molecular Biology and Genetics, Interior Architecture, the Architecture , the Management (Turkish) and the Tourism Management US \$ 5 000, for the Computer Engineering (English) and the Management (English) US \$ 6000 equal to Turkish Liras. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included.) The tuition is payable in two equal installments at the beginning of every academic semester. The tuition fees will be increased at most 5 percent as US \$ in a year. The medium is Turkish in Haliç University.

The accommodation fees are US \$ 1200 per person for an academic year. An extra fee is required for a private single bed. The fee is payable in two equal installments at the beginning of every academic semester. The accommodation fees will be increased at most 5 percent as US \$ in a year, if needed by the authorities of the University.
see 56. Işık University was established by Feyziye Mektepleri Foundation (FMV) which dates back roughly 115 years and is Turkey's first Educational Foundation. Instruction is given at FMV Ayazağa İstanbul Educational Campus. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Işık University are US \$ 7500 for all degree programs and Preparatory Course. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included).
The language of instruction is English. Students have to demonstrate that their level of English is adequate either they must pass the English Proficiency Test set by Işık University or have passed (within the last 2 years) such English examinations as TOEFL, TWE, IELTS, FCE and CPE which Işık University regards as equivalent. Students who fail to meet these requirements follow the Preparatory School Course. Those who are not successful are dismissed from the University. The successful ones commence the program they have been accepted into.
see 57. There is a one-year Greek Preparatory Course.
see 58. For students wishing to follow a one-year Preparatory Course in English or German with a quota there is an additional year of study. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation.
see 59. There is a one-year Russian Preparatory Course.
see 60. For the 2002-2003 academic year the tuition fees at Istanbul Bilgi University for the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences is US \$7350 and for all the other faculties is US \$ 7 050. The language of instruction is English with the exception of Law Faculty where some courses are thought in Turkish. Students take the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the international examinations (TOEFL, TWE) recognised by the University, Those who do not pass, follow an intensive English Course of the Foreign Languages Preparatory Department of the University. Students who pass the English Proficiency Test register into the program of higher education in which they have been placed This Preparatory Year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation.
see 61. The İstanbul Kültür University was established by the Education Foundation of the Kültür High School, Instruction is given at Şirinevler-Ataköy Campuses. In the 2002-2003 academic year tuition fees are, for the degree programs US \$ 6250 and for the Preparatory Course US \$ 6000 equal to Turkish Liras.
see 62. The İstanbul Commercial University was established by the Education and Social Services Foundation of the İstanbul Commercial Chamber and it is a trust-endowed University. For the 2002-2003 academic year tuition fees İstanbul Ticaret University are 8000000 000TL for all programs and for the English Preparatory Course 7000000 000TL. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included.) The tuition fees are payable in five installments.
The medium of instructions is Turkish supported by English. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study of graduation. Students who pass the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the international examinations (TOEFL, TOEFL WITH COMPUTER, CAMBRIDGE PROFICIENCY) recognised by the University, are eligible to register into the first year of the higher education program in which they have been placed.
see 63. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the tuition fees at Koç University are US \$ 12000.
see 64. To be successful in this program, dexterity of the hands and fingers is essential.
see 65. The language of instruction is English. The Preparatory Course offered by the Basic English Department of the Foreign Lan-

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guages School of METU covers at most a period of two semesters. Those who are unsuccessful in the Preparatory Course after a year, start a course in English in Summer School. At the end of the Summer School's Course, students take the English Proficiency Test. The stipulations for the attendance of the Course and the entrance of the examination are determined by the Department Council. If the students who are unsuccessful in the Proficiency Test at the end of the academic year, may again enter the Proficiency Test at the start of the following academic year.
The students who are unsuccessful in the examination held at the end of the academic year and/or Summer Course, may enter the Proficiency Test at the start of the next academic year.
The students who are unsuccessful in the Preparatory Course, may follow a Supporting Course in the next year or enter the Proficiency Test at the start of the other following year. The stipulations for the attendance of the course and the entrance of the examination are determined by the Department Council. If the students have been unsuccessful after one year of study in the Basic English Department and placed again at METU on the results of the Examination for Foreign Students may follow the Supporting Class or enter the Proficiency Test at the beginning of the following academic year. The stipulations for the attendance of the Supporting Class and the entrance of the Proficiency Test are determined by the Department Council.
If the students have been unsuccessful after two years of study in this department and placed again at METU on the results of the Examination for Foreign Students may not repeat the Preparatory Course. These students are given the space of one year in which to pass the English Proficiency Test organised by the University, or one of the international examinations (TOEFL, IELTS, CPE, CAE, FCE) (within the last two years) recognised by the University as being equivalent. Equivalencies of these examinations are valid for a period of two years. Students who are successful in any one of the examinations may register into the department in which they have been placed, otherwise they are dismissed. Those who, for the last two academic years, are successful in the Preparatory Course or pass the English Proficiency Test or study undergradute program of METU, are exempt from the Preparatory Course.
66. The students paid the tuition fees US $\$ 8200$ for all programs for the 2001-2002 academic year at Sabancı University. (Value Added Tax (VAT) not included). The tuition fees will be determined in January 2002 for 2002-2003 academic year by the University Council. Health Center Facilities are available to students. In addition to these facilities, Private Health Insurance are also available. Students don't pay for it.
The language of instruction is English. All students who have been registered are required to take the Proficiency Test. Those who do not attain the level required by the University in the Proficiency Test follow a one-year Basic Development Program. Students who are unsuccessful in this program are required to attend the Summer School and take the examination again. Students who are unsuccessful at the end of the academic year or Summer School, may take the Qualification Test at the beginning of the next academic year with the new students who have been registered into these programs. Those who are still unsuccessful cannot enter the course again but are allowed one year to work on their own and then enter the Qualification Test at the beginning of the next academic year with the new students who have been registered into the programs. The students who are still not successful, are dismissed from the University.The students who are unsuccessful in the Basic Development Program for a semester or a year and the new students who have been placed into the programs by YÖS, are not required to attend the Basic Development program. These students may take the Proficiency Test at the beginning of the academic year in which they have been reqistered or at the beginning of the next academic year. The students who are unsuccessful in the tests, have not been registered into the programs in which they have been placed.

Engineering and Natural Sciences Programs; Computer Science and Engineering, Biological Sciences and Bioengineering, Material Sciences and Engineering, Mecotronic Engineering, Microelectronic Engineering, Telecommunication Engineering, Production Systems Engineering lead to Bachelor Degrees; Art and Social Science Programs: Economy, Visual Arts and Visual Communacation Design, Cultural Studies, Community and Political Sciences also lead to Bachelor Degrees. Students are required to indicate programs they are interested in during the registration period. The field of the program which the students wish to commence their studies will be determined at the end of the second academic year.
see 67. In this program all students are required to study either German or English as their foreign language.
see 68. For the 2002-2003 academic year, the Yeditepe University tuition fees are as follows: for the Preparatory Course US \$ 4 950, for the Faculty of Medicine US \$ 9000 and for the Faculty of Dentistry US \$ 11 250, for the Faculty of Sciences and Arts, the Faculty of Law, the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences, the Faculty of Communication and the Faculty of Fine Arts US \$ 5400 for the Faculty of Engineering-Architecture US \$ 6750 and for the Preparatory Course US \$ 2475 per academic semester.
see 69. The language of instruction is English and Turkish. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. Students who pass the English Proficiency Test organised by the University or obtain an acceptable score in one of the international examinations (TOEFL) recognised by the University, are eligible to register into the first year of the higher education program in which they have been placed.
see 70. The language of instruction is English. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. At the beginning of the academic year, students who are successful in the English Proficiency Test or obtain an acceptable score in a TOEFL examination register directly into the higher education program in which they have been placed.
see 71. There is a one-year English Preparatory Course. This year is not included in the total number of years of study required for graduation. At the beginning of the academic year, students who are successful in the English Proficiency Test or obtain an acceptable score in a TOEFL, CAE, IELTS, FCE and CPE examination (within the last two years) register directly into the higher education program in which they have been placed.
see 72. The EMU is located in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, Gazimagusa. It is a state/trust-endowed University. The tuition fee for the academic year 2002-2003 is US \$ 3800. This fee does not include 3\% VAT and US \$ 15 contribution to 'Student Activities Fund'. The tuition fee is payable in two equal installments at the beginning of every academic semester. Partial exemption from the tuition fee is granted to those students who achieve a minimum CGPA of 3.00 and a minimum GPA of 3.50 in a given semester.
Various accommodation facilities are available to students on and off campus. Newly registered students are given priority in EMU accommodation. The accommodation fees range from US \$ 350 to 1000 per person for one semester depending on the accommodation options such as a single/double bed, a studio or an apartment. The students are required to pay the accommodation fees at the registration period of every semester.
see 73. The medium of instruction is Turkish. Students enrolling in this program are exempted from the English Preparatory Course.
